Airport Arrival Information

For members arriving by air at the Vancouver International Airport, the fastest and cheapest transportation to the Four Seasons Hotel is by Skytrain. From the arrivals level, follow the signs to the *Canada* Line Skytrain. One way fare for the Skytrain from the Airport is \$7.50 per person during off peak times and \$8.75 during peak fare periods (2 zones). This includes the extra \$5 fee for single riders leaving the airport. Peak fares are weekdays until 6:30 pm. Off peak are weekdays after 6:30 pm and all day Saturday, Sunday & Holidays. Regular fees are \$2.50 for one zone. The extra \$5 airport levy is not charge to those who have transit faresavers or bus passes (purchased prior to arrival).

All Skytrains leaving YVR will go to downtown Vancouver. The Four Seasons hotel is located at the Vancouver City Centre skytrain stop, which is near the end of the line. Once reaching this station, follow the signs to Pacific Centre Mall. The Four Seasons Hotel mall entrance is located across from the Apple Store & H&M. Alternatively, if you find yourself outside on the street – the Four Seasons is located on the corner of Howe and Georgia Streets.

Alternatively, taxis and limousines are available at the arrivals level. A regular taxi will cost approximately \$45 to the Hotel. Taxi's do not charge a flat fee, and will run a meter when travelling.

There is no shuttle bus from YVR to downtown Vancouver.

About the Hotel:

The Four Seasons Hotel is in a prime downtown location. The rooms do NOT have a coffee maker and no free coffee is provided in the room. See the pool area for free coffee. The hotel is able to rent coffee makers for around \$8 per day. Stocked Mini bar fridges are available in most rooms with limited room for your own beverages.

There is a gym and indoor/outdoor swimming pool located on the 4th floor. Free coffee and tea are available every morning at the pool. Free fresh fruit is also available most of the day. Cold fruit flavoured water is substituted for the coffee & tea later in the day.

Internet is included in the hotel charges. Ask for an internet code upon check in.

There is a large food fair and many coffee stands located in Pacific Centre Mall accessible from the ground level of the hotel.

Stanley Park is recognized around the globe as one of the great parks of the world! Stanley Park is an evergreen oasis of 400 hectares (1,000 acres) close to the downtown core. During the summer, you can "dance at dusk" at Ceperley Meadow, see local artists' work at Painters' Circle, and enjoy outdoor theatre with Theatre Under the Stars at Malkin Bowl. Family attractions include the Children's' Farmyard, Miniature Train, Vancouver Aquarium, Second Beach Pool and the water park at Lumbermen's Arch. Take a ride on the Horse & Carriage Ride or the free Shuttle Bus. Also, there are fine dining, gardens, and famous historical landmarks such as Prospect Point and Lost Lagoon.

BARD ON THE BEACH

Directions by public transit are From Vancouver; take the Sea Bus to Lonsdale Quay. From the bus loop take the #228 or the #229 bus. The #228 stops along Lynn Valley Rd. The #229 stops at the corner of Peters Rd & Duval Rd, a 2 minute walk from the park entrance.

ROBSON STREET

The place to see and be seen in Vancouver, energetic Robson Street boasts over 200 shops, cafés and services. Spend a day on the strip - spoil yourself in trend-setting fashion boutiques or sip a latté as you relax and people-watch from a sidewalk café.
